Money Terms

Cents is the unit we use to make up a whole dollar. 100 cents equals a dollar. Cents are written as a fraction of a dollar in decimals.

\$1.00 = one whole dollar = 100¢

The decimal point is placed after the whole dollar amount and before the cents.
